The former Lapinlahti psychiatric hospital and its future

The Lapinlahti hospital in Helsinki is a former psychiatric hospital that operated from 1841 to 2008. It was designed by a German architect Carl Ludvig Engel who is also responsible for many of the landmark buildings in the centre of Helsinki, e.g. the Helsinki Cathedral. The Lapinlahti hospital was one of the first modern psychiatric hospitals in Europe and played a key part in the development of mental health care in Finland. Over the decades, many prominent figures of Finnish culture, such as Aleksis Kivi, were treated in the hospital. The Lapinlahti hospital closed in 2008, and the last patients were relocated elsewhere. The builds stood vacant for few years, until Lapinlahden Lähde started operating in them in 2013. The old hospital has transformed into a centre and community of art, culture, and mental wellbeing. Nowadays, it organises e.g. events and activities, especially for vulnerable persons. The buildings of the Lapinlahti hospital are the property of the City of Helsinki. Currently, the city officials are planning to set up a new real estate company that would maintain the buildings in cooperation with an international real estate developer NREP. Alarmingly, the preliminary plans of City of Helsinki propose that NREP would acquire a majority stake in the new real estate company. The Lapinlahti community opposes relinquishing control of a Finnish national heritage site to an international real estate developer. The community argues that Lapinlahti hospital should remain in Finnish ownership. Moreover, the current plans for Lapinlahti threaten the vibrant urban community of artists, musicians, therapists, NGOs etc. that has grown in Lapinlahti organically over the past decade.
